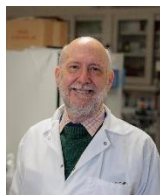
## Swine Influenza

Prof. Andrew S. Bowman, DVM, PhD, dip ACVMP, is Associate Professor in The Ohio State University College of Veterinary Medicine. His research investigates the ecology and epidemiology of influenza A viruses in swine and avian species in an effort to better understand their impact on public health, and is part of the collaborative network within the NIAID Centers of Excellence for Influenza Research and Surveillance (CEIRS).



## Canine influenza

Colin R. Parrish, PhD, is the John M. Olin Professor of Virology at the Baker Institute for Animal Health, College of Veterinary Medicine, Cornell University. His research focus has been on the evolution of viruses involved in switching hosts, leading to epidemic emergence, including canine influenza in dogs that emerged from equine influenza virus.



## Equine Influenza

Thomas M. Chambers, PhD, is the Jes & Clementine Schlaikjer Professor of equine infectious diseases at the Maxwell H. Gluck Equine Research Center, University of Kentucky. He studies equine influenza antigenic drift and vaccine performance, advises on vaccine strain updates, and conducts research on development of next-generation vaccines for use in horses.
